# The Life, Times, and Teachings of Shunryu Suzuki-roshi

Who was Suzuki-roshi? What were his teachings? What was the Japanese Buddhist world from which he came? What was the American Buddhism into which he came?

Since his death over 25 years ago, no attempt has been made to coherently assess Suzuki-roshi the person, the nature and context of his teaching, and his influence on American Buddhism. These years have perhaps provided enough distance for an objective view and appreciation; yet people who knew him are still alive to provide a rounded sense of him as a person and a teacher.

This conference will present a wide range of perspectives on Suzuki-roshi from students, friends, priests, family, and scholars who knew him.
