This realization increased my

upset greatly. Then, later,

during a break, I was wandering about in Hulsiac's Calligraphy Studio, alone, still upset et thinking about my harf-hearted zazen et calligraphy practices, when I became aware of someone in back of me. I turned around et saw Suzukiroshi looking at me with great intensity. This lasted perhaps a few seconds but it seemed a very long time. Then he turned away & continued his walk.

Although at the time I could not tell much about what had happened, he had done something to me?

That incldent grew in Significance as I noticed the improvement in the Sincerity of my practices.
